

# FLOOR SCRUBBER SAFETY

### INTRODUCTION

Floor scrubbing machines make quick work of removing contaminants, dust, and scuffs from the workplace floor. Unfortunately, these benefits also come with a certain amount of risk, especially if employees neglect to use them safely.



### **HAZARDS**

Injuries sustained from using a floor scrubbing machine incorrectly will most likely be a result of:

- Chemical hazards, depending on which chemicals are used.
- Ergonomic hazards from pushing and pulling the machine.
- Pinch points from moving parts.
- Slip and fall hazards.



## **SAFE WORK PRACTICES**

In order to avoid accidents, the following safety rules must be followed when operating a floor scrubbing machine:

- Understand all the manufacturer's instructions and warning labels before using the scrubber.
- Only use the floor scrubber machine if you have been trained and authorized.
- Before using, visually check that the machine is in good working condition, and do not use if there are any signs of damage.
  - Lock and tag out damaged machines and let your supervisor know.
- Make sure bystanders and coworkers stay a safe distance away while the scrubber is on.
- Use proper posture and body ergonomics when using the floor scrubber machine.
- Do not use attachments unless they have been approved by the manufacturer.
- Always keep your hands clear of moving parts.
- Do not bypass safety features or guards at any time.
- Never leave the floor scrubber machine unattended unless the key has been removed.
- Do not use the floor scrubber to transport people or objects.
- Foaming and/or flammable cleaning products should not be used in the scrubber.
- Do not use floor scrubbers to clean irritating substances such as strong acids or hazardous dust.
- Do not use the floor scrubber in areas where flammable substances are used or stored.







# FLOOR SCRUBBER SAFETY

## **STORAGE**

When finished using the floor scrubber unit, it must be serviced and stored appropriately to ensure continued good operating condition.

- Turn off the machine and remove the key.
- Empty the recovery and solution tanks and rinse the tanks with water.
- Make sure the unit is stored in a clean, dry location.
- Charge batteries as needed in a well-ventilated area, away from ignition sources.



# **CONCLUSION**

Floor scrubbing units can be very safe if used correctly, and can even make your workplace safer by eliminating hazardous bacteria. Employees who use these machines at work must make a conscious effort to avoid accidents by following the safety procedures.
